4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.22.45 of the Har5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking "12/31/2009" and inserting "12/31/2011".

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
8 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
9 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
10 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.
