Diphenyl sulfide, imported from Japan, is a raw material used in the manufacture of dichlorophenol and 2,4-dichlorophenoxy acetic acid. These chemicals are the active ingredients in various herbicide formulations that are used to control broadleaf weeds on crops such as wheat.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.29.06 of the Har5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 diphenyl sulfide) is amended by striking "12/31/2009"
7 and inserting "12/31/2011".

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- $2 \ \ {\rm the \ date \ of \ the \ enactment \ of \ this \ Act.}$
