Bill No. and sponsor: H.R. 4369 (Mr. Dan Burton of Indiana).

Proponent name,³ location: Dow AgroSciences, Indianapolis, IN.

Nature of bill: Extend temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Diphenyl sulfide (CAS No. 139-66-2) (provided for in subheading 2930.90.29).

Check one: Same as that in bill as introduced.

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

Diphenyl sulfide, imported from Japan, is a raw material used in the manufacture of dichlorophenol and 2,4-dichlorophenoxy acetic acid. These chemicals are the active ingredients in various herbicide formulations that are used to control broadleaf weeds on crops such as wheat.

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on diphenyl sulfide.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DIPHENYL SULFIDE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.29.06 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 diphenyl sulfide) is amended by striking “12/31/2009”
7 and inserting “12/31/2011”.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
