The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used as a raw material in the production of picloram. Picloram is the active ingredient in many herbicides, including herbicides that are used to prevent broadleaf weeds on rangeland and grass pastures. Dow AgroSciences imports the subject product from Japan.

A BILL

To extend and modify the temporary suspension of duty on 2-Cyanopyridine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. 2-CYANOPYRIDINE.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.22.35 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to 2-Cyanopyridine) is amended—

(1) by striking "Free" and inserting "3.2%";

and

(2) by striking "12/31/2009" and inserting

"12/31/2011".
