Hydraulic control units designed for use in braking systems of hybrid motor vehicles of heading 8703 (provided for in subheading 9032.89.60).

#### **Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

The subject product is an automatic control unit for the hydraulic braking function of a motor vehicle of heading 8703 that is considered to be a hybrid vehicle. This product is described by the proponent as being of a design, compatibility, and performance that can implement a unique brake-by-wire function used for hybrid vehicles. Such units are thought to be imported from France, Germany, Italy, Mexico,<sup>3</sup> and the United Kingdom.

Instead of creating a new HTS heading to continue to accord a duty suspension to this product, the bill should be amended to strike the proposed heading and to amend the expiration date of HTS heading 9902.10.62, by deleting "12/31/2009" from that heading and by inserting in lieu thereof "12/31/2011".
