Noils of camel hair (provided for in subheading 5103.10.00).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

This bill covers noils of camel hair. Noils are a type of waste and are the short fibers discarded during the combing process in making combed yarns. Camel hair noils are typically mixed with other fibers such as wool or cashmere and made into blended yarns. Camel hair noils are provided for in HTS subheading 5103.10.00, which covers noils of wool or of fine animal hair. U.S. imports under HTS 5103.10.00 totaled \$1.4 million in 2007. China was the primary supplier of such noils in 2007, followed by Australia.⁴

- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
- 6 by striking "12/31/2009" and inserting "12/31/2011".
- 7 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 8 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
- 9 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
- 10 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.
