Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Cathode-ray data/graphic display tubes, color, with a phosphor dot screen pitch of 0.305 mm or more but not exceeding 0.315 mm, a 90-degree deflection, a video display diagonal of 69.5 cm or more and an aspect ratio of 1 to 1 (provided for in subheading 8540.40.00).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

These tubes are replacement parts for CRT-based monitors used by air traffic controllers.

Japan was the principal import source for these tubes in 2007, with \$67,000 of total dutiable imports of \$404,000 under HTS statistical reporting number 8540.40.0080. The Netherlands was the leading import source under this HTS provision overall.
