⁴ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

The Commission staff suggests that, in line 6 of the bill, "12/31/11" be deleted and "12/31/2011" be inserted in lieu thereof.
