4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.29.25 of the Har5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking "12/31/2009" and inserting "12/31/2011".

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
8 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
9 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
10 the date of the enactment of this Act.
