The subject product is the active ingredient in BALANCE® PRO, a herbicide that is used on small-seeded broadleaf weeds and tough grasses, by working through both the shoots and roots of weeds. The product is imported from Finland.

Technical comments:⁴

The Commission staff suggests that the article description on page 1 of this report be used in the proposed new heading in order to provide the correct chemical name and the correct subheading reference. In addition, the Commission staff suggests that the phrase "by striking heading 9902.11.46 and" in line 8 of section 1(a) of the bill be deleted because heading 9902.11.46 provides a temporary duty reduction to the unmixed chemical that is referenced in this bill, whereas this bill would apply to mixtures of that chemical. As such, the product coverage of heading 9902.11.46 differs from the product coverage of this bill.

⁴ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.
