The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used in the production of black color formers. Paper manufacturers use color formers to produce thermal and carbonless paper for a variety of receipts, labels, tickets, tags, and multi-part forms. The product is imported from Japan and China.

6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following

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8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to articles entered, or withdrawn

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- 1 from warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day
- 2 after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
