Nature of bill: Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

(3-Phenoxyphenyl)methyl 3-(2,2-dichloroethenyl)-2,2-dimethylcyclopropanecarboxylate (Permethrin) (CAS No. 52645-53-1) (provided for in subheading 2916.20.50).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used as an agricultural insecticide on major crops. It is principally imported from China and India.⁴

The Commission staff notes that H.R. 4722, H.R. 5011, and H.R. 5417 each would extend the temporary duty suspension that is provided for in HTS heading 9902.10.80. Only one bill should be enacted.

- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 Permethrin) is amended by striking "12/31/2009" and in-
- 7 serting "12/31/2011".
- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 10 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 11 the date of the enactment of this Act.
