The subject product is used on cotton crops primarily as a postemergence herbicide to provide control of grasses and broadleaf weeds. In some conditions it may also be used for preemergence applications. The product is imported from Japan.

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
