**MEMORANDUM ON PROPOSED TARIFF LEGISLATION  
of the 110<sup>th</sup> Congress<sup>1</sup>**

**Bill No. and sponsor:** H.R. 4887 (Mr. Bob Filner of California).

**Proponent name<sup>3</sup>, location:** Hitachi America, Ltd., Brisbane, CA.

**Other bills on product (110<sup>th</sup> Congress only):** None.

**Nature of bill:** Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

**Retroactive effect:** None.

**Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):**

Camcorders each capable of recording and reproducing video images on mini-DVD media in all the following formats: DVD-R, DVD-RW, DVD-RAM, or DVD+RW, the foregoing each with 25 power optical zoom and a lens diameter of 34 mm (provided for in subheading 8525.80.50).

**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

A camcorder is an electronic device combining a video camera and video recorder in one device. The camcorder that is covered by this bill records video images onto a medium known as mini-DVD, an optical recording disc of 80 cm in diameter. There are four separate recording formats for mini-DVD media: DVD-R, DVD-RW, DVD-RAM, or DVD+RW. The subject camcorder can record and reproduce images using all of these formats. Such a camcorder also incorporates a USB 2.0 port to permit video images to be uploaded to and downloaded from a computer.


Dutiable U.S. imports of all goods under HTS subheading 8525.80.50 exceeded \$1.6 billion in 2007. Japan is the principal source of such camcorders, with nearly \$992 million in imports. The subheading covers other goods in addition to the subject camcorders.

**Technical comments:<sup>4</sup>**

The title of this bill and the parenthetical reference to the coverage of the HTS heading describe these goods as DVD readers and writers. However, the goods in question are camcorders that contain a DVD reader/writer, and using that language would help make the intent of the bill clearer.

<sup>4</sup> The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

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## A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on certain DVD readers and writers.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. CERTAIN DVD READERS AND WRITERS.**

4       (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.23.35 of the Har-  
5       monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to  
6       certain DVD readers and writers) is amended by striking  
7       the date in the effective period column and inserting “12/  
8       31/2011”.

9       (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
10      subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

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- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
