The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used as an intermediate in the production of polyimide films and resins. The polyimide films have a variety of uses including electrical insulation, substrates for printed electronic circuits, and magnetic tapes. The subject product is imported from China and Japan.

This bill would decrease the temporary applied rate of duty from 1.5 percent ad valorem to 1.0 percent ad valorem, a decrease of 0.5 percentage points. Therefore, there will be a customs revenue loss of \$45,000 related to this bill for 2009.

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on 4,4'-Oxydianiline.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, SECTION 1. 4,4'-OXYDIANILINE. 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.05.12 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amend-6 ed— (1) by striking "1.5%" and inserting "1.0%"; 7 8 and (2) by striking "12/31/2009" and inserting 9 "12/31/2011".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 2 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
- 3 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after

4 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
