The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used to produce a ketene derivative at the proponent's plant in Kingsport, Tennessee. The ketene derivative is, in turn, used to make pigments. The subject product may also be used as a color-former for manufacturing thermal paper. The subject product is imported from Germany.

- 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.10.43 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 2,4-Xylidine) is amended by striking "12/31/2009" and
- 7 inserting "12/31/2011".
- 8 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 9 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
- 10 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after

- 1 the date that is 15 days after the date of enactment of
- 2 this Act.
