Technical comments:⁴

The Commission staff notes that H.R. 3671 and H.R. 4965 cover the same product. H.R. 3671 would temporarily suspend the duty on the subject product, whereas H.R. 4965 would extend the existing temporary duty reduction. Only one bill should be enacted.

⁴ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.
