The Commission staff suggests that the article description on page 1 of this report be used in heading 9902.28.19 in order to provide the correct chemical name.

The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.
