(a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.03.79 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
mixtures of thiophanate methyl and application adjuvants)
is amended by striking "12/31/2009" and inserting "12/
31/2011".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
