Bill No. and sponsor: H.R. 5075 (Mr. Tim Murphy of Pennsylvania).

Proponent name,³ location: Bayer MaterialScience, Pittsburgh, PA.

Nature of bill: Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Polyisocyanate cross linking agent products containing triphenylmethane triisocyanate in solvents (provided for in subheading 3824.90.28).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is used as a cross linking agent in adhesives that are based on polyurethane, natural rubber or synthetic rubber, and as an adhesion promoter on rubber-based substrates. The product is imported from Germany.

A BILL

To extend the suspension of duty on Desmodur R-E.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DESMODUR R-E.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.11.83 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 Polyisocyanate cross linking agent products containing
7 triphenylmethane triisocyanate in solvents) is amended by
8 striking “12/31/2009” and inserting “12/31/2011”.

9 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
10 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
