Proponent name,³ location: Applied Materials, Inc., Santa Clara, CA.

Nature of bill: Temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

30 kV AC insulated cables fitted with connectors, measuring approximately 30 mm² in cross-sectional area (provided for in subheading 8544.60.20).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

According to the proponent, the subject goods are electrical conductors composed of wires fitted with connectors and suitable for carrying higher voltages than household current. They are designed to carry electrical power from the source to an electrically powered machine or motor. Germany, China, and Taiwan are the principal sources reported for these imports. Dutiable U.S. imports under HTS subheading 8544.60.20 (a broader category than is covered by this bill) totaled approximately \$25.6 million in 2007, of which Germany accounted for about \$9.3 million in shipments.

Technical comments:5

Little specific information was provided by the proponent. At a minimum, the proposed product description should be amended as shown on page 1, to conform with other nomenclature usage in the HTS; the HTS cannot contain part numbers or other company-specific criteria as shown in the bill as drafted. Although the descriptor "mid-frequency" (not "high-frequency" as shown in the bill) was supplied by the proponent in a fact sheet, this term has no definition and would not ordinarily be used in the HTS. No subsequent information supplied by the proponent can be added to specify a range of voltages or other technical characteristics for these goods. Because the inclusion of precise physical dimensions may pose a burden to the administration of this provision by Customs and Border Protection and might operate to minimize the range of goods actually afforded the benefit of an enacted provision, the word "approximately" has been inserted in the recommended revision. We are available to work with the proponent and with Customs to try to arrive at a better description of the goods in question.

⁵ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.
