Polymer blend containing 1,4-benzenedicarboxylic acid dimethyl ester, polymerized with 1,4-butanediol and decanedioic acid (CAS No. 59914-11-3), starch, and glycerol (CAS No. 56-81-5) (provided for in subheading 3907.99.01).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is a biodegradable thermoplastic polyester polymer blend containing starch and plasticizers that is used in blow molding formulation applications for various bags and films. It is marketed as light yellow opaque solid pellets having a melting point starting at 110°C and a density of 1.24g/cc. The product is imported from Italy.
