

Is age a factor?

Addressing weak sections of your application:

- GPA overall and science
 - Take REAL, upper division, graded science courses!
- MCAT scores
 - Read, read, read, and read
 - Practice tests (timed!) before study!
- Application essays
 - Get help and prepare 7 drafts over 2 weeks

Addressing weak sections of your application:

- Experience
 - Patient contact in a clinical setting
 - Research
- Letters
 - Rethink your assets
- Interview
 - Practice, public speaking courses/opportunities
 - Read more!
- State of residence and choice of schools





Writing sample

- 1. Developing a central idea
