H.R. 3315, to provide that the great hall of the Capitol Visitor Center shall be known as Emancipation Hall. Signed on December 18, 2007. (Public Law 110–139)

H.R. 6, to move the United States toward greater energy independence and security, to increase the production of clean renewable fuels, to protect consumers, to increase the efficiency of products, buildings, and vehicles, to promote research on and deploy greenhouse gas capture and storage options, and to improve the energy performance of the Federal

Government, and for other purposes. Signed on December 19, 2007. (Public Law 110–140)

H.R. 4118, to exclude from gross income payments from the Hokie Spirit Memorial Fund to the victims of the tragic event at Virginia Polytechnic Institute & State University. Signed on December 19, 2007. (Public Law 110–141)

H.R. 3648, to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to exclude discharges of indebtedness on principal residences from gross income, and for other purposes. Signed on December 20, 2007. (Public Law 110–142)

H.R. 365, to provide for a research program for remediation of closed methamphetamine production laboratories, and for other purposes. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–143)

H.R. 710, to provide that criminal penalties do not apply to paired donations of human kidneys, and for other purposes. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–144)

H.R. 2408, to designate the Department of Veterans Affairs outpatient clinic in Green Bay, Wisconsin, as the "Milo C. Huempfner Department of
