The Shawnee National Forest Newsletter with the Schedule of Proposed Actions October 2008

"The Shawnee Quarterly" is the Shawnee National Forest's National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) newsletter. The Quarterly is published four times a year: January, April, July, and October. It provides planning information on the management and use of the Forest and includes a copy of the Forest's Schedule of Proposed Actions.

The Schedule of Proposed Actions lists actions proposed or in progress that require consideration under NEPA prior to implementation. The purpose of the Schedule of Proposed Actions is to provide early, informal notice of the proposed projects so that you can be aware of Forest activities, indicate your interest in specific projects, and become involved early in the environmental analysis and documentation process. The schedule also provides information associated with the current status of environmental analysis or planning of ongoing projects.

New projects are listed with the *NEW LISTING* identifier in the title box on the Schedule of Proposed Actions. You can become part of the decision-making process by commenting on all projects that interest you. Projects are sorted in tables by nation-wide projects, the Supervisor's Office (for Forest-wide projects), or by the Ranger District where the action is proposed. The name of a contact is provided with each project and comments or questions should be directed to this contact person.

SCOPING FOR PROJECTS EXPECTED TO BE CATEGORICALLY EXCLUDED:

Projects listed in the Schedule of Proposed Actions followed by "CE" are expected to be categorically excluded from extensive analysis under NEPA. In an effort to conserve resources by avoiding duplicative mass-mailings, and commensurate with their expected scope and intensity, the Forest announces scoping for these projects in this Quarterly newsletter. Sufficient details of proposals are provided to enable

comments on the projects. If you wish to receive further information on any project, please contact the individual listed.

Comments will be accepted for three weeks following publication of the Quarterly.

Some categorically excluded decisions are subject to notice, comment and appeal under the appeal regulations (36 CFR 215). These types of projects, mostly prescribed burning, will be scoped separately and included in the Schedule of Proposed Actions.

New projects listed in this month's Schedule of Proposed Actions that are expected to be categorically excluded include:

Big Muddy Boat Ramp Reforestation.

This project will involve the reforestation of 26 acres with native seedlings. The area is adjacent to an existing boat ramp near the Big Muddy Levee. Contact Ronald Moore, 618-833-8576, ronaldmoore@fs.fed.us

Management Note: Many of our routine projects like trail maintenance and recreation site maintenance do not require a decision memo and do not require that the Forest maintain a NEPA file. These types of projects do not need to be routinely noticed in the quarterly. These types of projects will continue and some new projects may be scoped in this Quarterly Newsletter but will no longer appear in the Schedule of Proposed Actions.

Johnson Creek Road Realignment. This project involves leveling and rocking a portion of the Johnson Creek Campground Road so that two-way traffic may access the campground safely. This is a temporary realignment until permanent reconstruction of a slumped section is completed. Contact Ronald Moore, 618-833-8576, ronaldmoore@fs.fed.us

Lake Glendale Recreation Area Maintenance.

Replace about three miles of the water system and replace the antiquated sewage treatment system. The project would involve removal of existing lines, trenching for new lines and constructing four to five engineered, low-mound septic systems. These mounds would replace two treatment lagoon systems nearing their useful life. We anticipate less than one acre of total ground disturbance for all of these septic systems combined.

Renewal of existing land-use permits. This includes right of way for access and powerline, waterline and telephone line permits. Permits scheduled for re-issuance include the following:
