Graduate Curatorial Internships 2009–2010

Purpose

Graduate Curatorial Internships at the National Gallery of Art provide in-depth training for advanced PhD students and recent PhD recipients interested in gaining curatorial experience in a museum setting. Graduate curatorial interns work with curators on permanent collection and exhibition projects and attend a weekly museum seminar that introduces the staff, departments, programs, and functions of the Gallery. The duties and responsibilities are comparable to those of curatorial assistants.

Eligibility

Eligibility is limited to doctoral students who are in the advanced stage of preparing their dissertations and to recent PhD recipients (dissertations must have been filed no earlier than September 2007). Neither previous museum experience nor a stated goal of a museum career is required. Applicants from all backgrounds are encouraged to apply. This is an international program.

Procedure for Application Form
