SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The speeches and testimony in the first two volumes pertain to the role of Maurice Stans as Deputy Postmaster General. He spoke in support of bills affecting the Post Office Department, its employees and activities, before the House and Senate sub-committees on appropriations. He addressed both the House and Senate Post Office and Civil Service Committees on several occasions. He also spoke at dedications of new post offices, the issue of stamps, and to professional postal workers. Whenever he addressed groups such as the American Legion, Local chambers of commerce, and certified public accountants, he attempted to explain the policies and functions of the Post Office.

The last two volumes contain speeches and testimony of Maurice Stans, given as the Budget Director. He appeared before the House and Senate sub-committees concerned with expenditures for new projects. On several occasions he explained the federal budget before congressional committees, at pressconferences, and on televised interviews. When he spoke to groups outside the federal government (such as business schools, tax executives institutes and bankers associations) he selected sections of the federal budget which applied to each group.
