5. All other papers which contain information or statements that might be used to injure, harass, or damage any living person.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers of Donald A. Quarles span the years 1950-59 when he held various positions with the Department of Defense and defense contractors. Several documents are dated prior to 1950 and one is dated 1960.

The most significant material is located in the first two document series. Daily diaries kept while Quarles was Secretary of the Air Force and Deputy Secretary of Defense reveal the individuals with whom he dealt and the problems which crossed his desk. However, the substance of meetings and conversations are noted infrequently. The trip file contains notes of Quarles' trips to military research and development installations in 1950 and 1951. Among these notes are technical data on military weapons and proposals for new research and development facilities and commands. Quarles made these trips and received these documents in his capacity as Vice President of Bell Labs, Vice President of Western Electric, and President of Sandia Corporation.

The correspondence file contains letters which are mostly personal and congratulatory in nature. Few items deal with substantive issues. The speech file contains Quarles' principal addresses, transcripts of press conference, and statements to congressional committees as Secretary of the Air Force and Deputy Secretary of Defense. These items reveal his position on strategic military thinking in the Eisenhower administration and Department of Defense and Department of the Air Force administrative matters (e.g. military pay, military construction, appropriations). There are several speeches from the period prior to Quarles' service in government.

The fifth document series covers Quarles' activities in professional organizations. The largest quantity of material in this series was generated during his tenure as president and later as a member of the board of directors of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers. The correspondence and memoranda in this series focus on the routine business of the AIEE.

The final two series contain a miscellany of correspondence, articles and awards. The correspondence is usually personal in nature. The articles and papers written by Quarles focus on Department of Defense matters. The awards detail the numerous honors he received in both his business and government careers.

The arrangement of the collection was provided by the archivist. Numerous audiovisual and museum items have been removed from the collection and transferred to the Eisenhower Library's Audiovisual Collection and the Eisenhower Museum for preservation.
