SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of electrostatic copies of records of interviews pertaining to the function and origin of the Cabinet Secretariat during the Eisenhower Administration. Included are questions and answers that define the position of special assistant for Cabinet coordination, the position of Secretary to the Cabinet, the position of Assistant to the Secretary to the Cabinet, and positions for Cabinet coordination at the agency and department level. The interviews deal with the process of decision-making at Cabinet meetings, the effectiveness of post-Cabinet meetings and the nature of "Cabinet papers". Incidentally included are remarks on the origin of Mission 66. These interviews were conducted by Stephen Horn as preparations for an intended article on the Eisenhower Cabinet Secretariat.
