# PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE NOMENCLATURE AND EXPLANATORY NOTES CONCERNING POLYMERS

(Item II.13 on Agenda)

#### Reference documents:

41.480 (RSC/16) 41.580, Annex B/17 (RSC/16 - Report)

#### I. BACKGROUND

 At its 16th Session (September 1997), the Harmonized System Review Sub-Committee quickly examined a proposal by the Canadian Administration concerning the terminology used to name polymers in the HS Nomenclature and Explanatory Notes. However, given the technical nature of this question, the Sub-Committee decided to submit it to the Scientific Sub-Committee.

#### II. SECRETARIAT COMMENTS

- 2. For the comments submitted by the Canadian Administration, the Scientific Sub-Committee is referred to the RSC/16 working document, 41.180. As can be seen in paragraph 7 of that document, Canada has proposed a two-stage approach for clarifying polymer names in the Harmonized System: (i) certain editorial revisions to the French version of the Nomenclature and Explanatory Notes for Chapter 39 and (ii) a systematic revision of polymer names (French and English) in other parts of the Harmonized System to the format suggested by the IUPAC/ISO. As noted by Canada in subparagraph 7 (b), if the Sub-Committee agrees to pursue the second stage, it would submit further proposals to the Secretariat in that regard.
- 3. Specific proposals concerning the first stage proposed by Canada are set forth in Annex B to Doc. 41.480. The Secretariat's comments concerning both stages of the proposal are given in paragraphs 8 to 15 of that document.

### III. CONCLUSIONS

- 4. The Sub-Committee is requested to examine the general two-stage approach proposed by Canada (paragraph 7 to Doc. 41.480) and to give its views on the following:
  - (a) whether to take a limited or systematic approach to the Canadian proposal (see paragraphs 12 and 13 of Doc. 41.480);
  - (b) whether the first-stage amendments proposed by Canada in Annex B to Doc. 41.480 are acceptable; and
  - (c) if the Sub-Committee agrees to pursue the second stage, whether the products listed in paragraph 14 to Doc. 41.480 are within the scope of polymer names for possible amendment.
