SURVEY ON FREE TRADE AGREEMENTS

(Item II.10 on Agenda)

I. INTRODUCTION

1. To provide accurate information to all Member administrations about free trade agreements (hereinafter referred to as "FTAs") and their importance vis-à-vis the Harmonized System, the Secretariat carried out a "survey on free trade agreements" and reported on the matter to the Harmonized System Committee at its 27th and 28th Sessions. At its 28th Session, it was pointed out that the expression, "Customs or Economic Unions" had a specific meaning and significance under the HS Convention. The Secretariat was therefore instructed to look into the expressions "Customs union" and "Free trade area" in Annex I to Doc. NC0455E1 for the next session of the Committee and correct any mis-characterizations (NC0510E2, paragraphs 43-46, HSC/28 - Report).

II. SECRETARIAT SURVEY

2. According to Article 11 of the HS Convention, Customs or Economic Unions are eligible to become a Contracting Party to that Convention when competence has been transferred to the Unions to enter into treaties in respect of some or all of the matters governed by the Convention.
3. Furthermore, if either one of the following conditions is met, a Customs or Economic Union and its Member States, which are concurrently Contracting Parties, shall together exercise only one vote in the HS Committee (paragraph 4, Article 6 of the Convention).

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- Customs or Economic Union as well as one or more of its Member States are Contracting Parties.
- All the Member States of a Customs or Economic Union which is eligible to become a Contracting Party under the provisions of Article 11(b) become Contracting Parties.

Therefore, if a Customs or Economic Union itself is not a Contracting Party even if it has one or more Contracting Parties as its Member States, such Member States shall separately excise their vote in the HS Committee.

4. On the other hand, the Secretariat would like to stress that the expressions "Customs Union" and "Free-trade area" used in Annex I to Doc. NC0445E1 were based upon the provisions of GATT Article XXIV, paragraph 8 of which provides as follows :
 - A "Customs union" shall be understood to mean the substitution of a single customs territory for two or more customs territories, so that duties and other restrictive regulations of commerce are eliminated with respect to substantially all the trade between the constituent territories of the union or at least with respect to substantially all the trade in products originating in such territories, and so that substantially the same duties and other regulations of commerce are applied by each of the members of the union to the trade of territories not included in the union.
 - A "Free-trade area" shall be understood to mean a group of two or more customs territories in which the duties and other regulations of commerce are eliminated on substantially all the trade between the constituent territories in products originating in such territories.
5. Taking this opportunity, the Secretariat has updated the information provided in Doc. NC0445E1 as set out in Annexes I to III. The information provided is again mainly based on data obtained from the WTO Web site concerning "regional trade agreements notified to the GATT/WTO and in force as of 31 January 2002". The Secretariat has also included information provided through the Internet from various sources, including multinational organizations such as the EC, EFTA, MERCOSUR, COMESA and the governments of some countries. For the purposes of this survey, countries mean members of the FTAs, including territories. For convenience of analysis, shares of imports from FTA countries were computed based on 1999 trade statistics from the "Direction of Trade Statistics Yearbook" published by the International Monetary Fund in 2000. The survey was limited only to trade in goods.
6. Annex I to this document provides some information on FTAs such as the number of members of the FTAs, names of member countries, date of entry into force and types of agreements. As compared with the last survey, the number of FTAs listed has increased from 144 to 149. However, the number of FTA countries listed has remained unchanged at 145. Among the 149 FTAs listed most (75.80%) were established among or with European countries including the EC, EFTA and/or CEFTA countries.

7. Annex II sets out trade information for 1999 for all countries which had FTAs in July 2001. The EC, EFTA and CEFTA countries have established FTAs with 30 countries or more and more than 70 % of total imports come from FTA member countries.
8. Annex III shows the distribution of country groups with different levels of the shares of imports from FTA member countries in terms of total import value in 1999. In the case of 29 countries, more than 70% of the total import value came from the FTA member countries. For one-third (47 countries) of the 145 FTA member countries, over 50% of total imports came from FTA member countries. The average of all shares of imports from FTA member countries in terms of total import value was about 55 % and almost half (US\$ 2,464 billion) (42.5%) of the total world trade of goods (US\$ 5,793.6 billion) was traded among FTA member countries.

III. SECRETARIAT COMMENTS

9. In view of the foregoing, it can be seen that FTAs play a very important role in world trade. 145 Countries are involved in one or more FTAs and almost half (42.5 %) of world trade occurs between FTA member countries. Moreover, as the number of FTAs increases, the share of imports subject to free rates of duty will increase.
10. This trend raises two considerations in respect of the Harmonized System as reported at the 27th and 28th Sessions of the Harmonized System Committee :
 - Since FTAs eliminate Customs duties between members as against non-members, the Harmonized System is essential for that purpose. Trade statistics based on the Harmonized System will also be essential to that end. Therefore, the Harmonized System plays an important role in the development and implementation of FTAs.
 - Since FTAs allow duty free entry for all goods originating in FTA member countries as against non-members, preferential rules of origin are essential and the Harmonized System is important to FTAs whose rule of origin is based on change in tariff classification.

IV. CONCLUSION

11. The Committee is requested to take note of the results of the Secretariat's survey.
