SURVEY ON THE USE OF THE HS EXPLANATORY NOTES

(Item III.2 on Agenda)

I. INTRODUCTION

- The HS Explanatory Notes are essential to achieving uniform and correct classification in the Harmonized System, not only for classification experts who may work at Customs headquarters, a Classification Centre or in regional or local classification units of administrations but also for officers working in declaration processing units, post-clearance audit units, risk assessment units, etc.
- 2. The Secretariat has recognised that in some countries there have not been sufficient supplies of the Explanatory Notes in the original English or French version or in translated versions, so that Customs officers have serious problems in carrying out their classification work.
- 3. The Secretariat has also noticed that in some countries the original English or French version is copied and used by officers to achieve uniform and correct classification. Furthermore, in certain countries, electronic versions of the Explanatory Notes are used in the form of CD-ROM or Intranet/Internet publications. These initiatives are very important in achieving uniform and correct classification, thus contributing to trade facilitation. At the same time, such practices raise copyright issues which have to be considered separately.
- 4. In order to better understand the situation in our Member administrations, particularly in developing countries, and to help us to respond to the needs of our Members with regard to the publication of the Explanatory Notes, the Secretariat decided to carry out a comprehensive survey on the use of the HS Explanatory Notes, taking into account the above factors. A copy of the questionnaire is attached at Annex I to this document.

5. To date the Secretariat has received replies from the following 40 administrations: Austria, Bermuda, Botswana, Brunei, Burkina Faso, Canada, Columbia, Cyprus, Denmark, Fiji, Finland, Gabon, Hong Kong China, Hungary, Indonesia, Ireland, Jordan, Korea (Rep.), Lithuania, Macau, Malaysia, Maldives, Mauritius, Mexico, Myanmar, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Pakistan, Peru, Poland, Romania, Singapore, Slovakia, Sri Lanka, Swaziland, Switzerland, Trinidad & Tobago, Turkey and Ukraine.

II. SECRETARIAT SURVEY

6. Relevant replies to the questionnaire are summarised below as well as in Annex II to this document.

Questions 1(1) and 2(1) (see Table 1)

7. All countries which have answered the above questions are using the original 1996 version of the Explanatory Notes, although translated versions have not been amended properly in a few countries.

Questions 1(2) and 2(2) (see Table 2 and Chart 1)

8. For those countries using the original versions, there is an indication that a sufficient number of Explanatory Notes has not been distributed to regional or local offices. For those countries using translated versions, a sufficient number of Explanatory Notes was distributed, even to regional or local offices.

Questions 1(4) and 1(7) (see Table 3)

9. Many countries are interested in a cheaper version of the Explanatory Notes.

Questions 1(5) and 2(4) (see Table 4)

10. In some countries, the trade community does not have access to the original version of the Explanatory Notes.

Questions 3 and 4 (see Tables 5 and 6)

- 11. Tables 5 and 6 summarise the use of CD-ROM and Internet versions.
- 12. Table 7 and Chart 2 summarise, on the basis of the foregoing, the type of the Explanatory Notes distributed among the countries which have submitted replies. Table 8 shows that in some countries legal status is given to the Explanatory Notes (Question 5(1)).

III. SECRETARIAT COMMENTS

13. The Secretariat would like to express its appreciation to those countries which have sent replies to the questionnaire set out in Annex I to this document.

- 14. Generally speaking, the original versions of the Explanatory Notes have not been well distributed to regional or local offices as compared with the translated versions, which have been relatively well distributed as shown in Table 2 and Chart 1. The Secretariat considers that selling a cheaper version may be one of the solutions to this problem, bearing in mind the result as shown in Table 3 (see paragraph 9 above). The Secretariat intends to take this factor into account in publishing the 2002 version of the Explanatory Notes.
- 15. As regards the access of the trade community to the Explanatory Notes (Table 4), the Secretariat would urge the trade to make more use of the WCO Web site in connection with information regarding the publication of the Explanatory Notes. Administrations are also invited to encourage the trade community to access the WCO Web site.
- 16. Questions 3 and 4 mainly relate to the issue of the protection of the WCO's copyright with regard to the Explanatory Notes. The Secretariat would point out that this matter should be addressed on a case by case basis. The Secretariat may be in touch with individual administrations in connection with this issue in the future.
- 17. For the information of the Committee, the WCO has taken the position in the past that it would allow the translation and printing of the Explanatory Notes in languages other than French or English. In addition, the WCO has authorized Member administrations to print copies of the Explanatory Notes in French and English upon request and provided that the copies are made for the use of the administration only.

IV. CONCLUSION

18. The Committee is invited to take note of the above information and to express any views with regard to this matter.

Chart 1. ARE EXPLANATORY NOTES DISTRIBUTED IN SUFFICIENT NUMBERS?




Chart 2. TYPES OF EXPLANATORY NOTES USED
