Residency Special Features: Residents will provide care to veterans in both outpatient and inpatient situations. They lead patient education classes for smoking cessation, diabetes, and hypertension. Inpatient activities include rounding with the physicians and participating at interdisciplinary team meetings on the acute care, intensive care, psychiatric care, and long-term care units. Residents are given the opportunity to do rotations with the Hepatitis C, anticoagulation, and pain clinics. Residents are also exposed to and participate in a variety of committees and specialty programs, such as

P&T, Healthcare Failure Mode Effect Analysis Process Committees, Medication error, and Telehealth.

Fringe Benefits: 13 Vacations Days and 13 Sick Days. Paid Federal Holidays. Health Insurance. Travel allowances to selected professional meetings. Housing on site.

Special Requirements for Acceptance: The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, a graduate of an accredited school of pharmacy, and hold an active pharmacy license or be eligible for licensure in any U.S. state or territory.
