Salisbury VA Medical Center

- Located in Central North Carolina, Salisbury VAMC is a 458-bed tertiary care facility affiliated with the University of North Carolina School of Pharmacy, Campbell University School of Pharmacy, Wingate School of Pharmacy, the University of Florida School of Pharmacy, Wake Forest University School of Medicine, and Virginia College of Osteopathic Medicine. It serves as a training site for students and residents in multiple disciplines, including: nursing, dentistry, optometry, pharmacy, psychiatry, rehabilitation, and medicine.
- The medical center provides medical, surgical, psychiatric, and ambulatory services to the more than 300,000 veterans in its service area. It boasts a full-service clinic in Winston-Salem as well as a newly expanded Community-Based Outpatient Clinic (CBOC) in Charlotte and a second CBOC in Hickory opening in 2008.
- Salisbury VAMC has six clinical pharmacy specialists (all with prescribing privileges), eleven clinical pharmacists in primary care clinics, and one acute care clinical pharmacist.
