7:00pm **Dennis Becker**, research scientist with the Pacific Northwest Research Station, will discuss **Matching Utilization Options with Resource Constraints and Community Needs.** Dennis has worked extensively in Idaho and the Columbia River Basin. He is currently collecting data in three primary areas of small diameter timber utilization: (1) Elemental time-motion studies of forest harvest systems to determine harvesting costs; (2) Ways small diameter timber can be processed and linked with varying markets; and (3) How communities might capitalize on small wood processing opportunities, examining the capacity of the timber industry to process small diameter timber, and providing technical support in the development of collaborative partnerships.
