#### Shipping Scene at Bivalve, New Jersey

The photograph featured here was taken by a Mr. Harvey W. Porch of Bridgeton, NJ, ca. 1926, and was used by the Philadelphia District office (at Wilmington, DE) of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to chronicle the workings of the oyster industry in the region. The photo is part of an extensive photographic survey of the oyster industry located at the mouth of the Maurice River in Southern New Jersey. The survey was undertaken by the Corps of Engineers as required by the River and Harbor Act of 1925 which authorized the Corps to examine

and survey specifically designated waterways to determine whether improvements to navigation were needed. The Maurice River was one of the waterways slated to be examined as designated by the Act. The photographs were used to document the environmental and economic impact dredging and other improvements would have on the oyster industries in the area.

Access to the Maurice River was governed by its tides and the draft of its sailing vessels. Certain barges with deeper drafts were denied access to the Maurice River at low tide.

It was the recommendation of the Philadelphia District office that the entrance channel of the Maurice River be dredged to a depth of 8 feet and widened to 150 feet to allow continuous access by barges and ships with deeper drafts. The oyster industry in South Jersey was devastated in the 1950s by a seaborne virus that destroyed the oyster population in the Delaware River. Global warming has also added to the destruction of the oyster beds in the Delaware River and has

reduced the oyster industry of South Jersey to a shell of its former self.

The photo is drawn from the records holdings of Record Group 77, Records of the Office of the Chief of Engineers, from the Mid Atlantic Regional branch of the National Archives and Records Administration. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers was established by an Act of Congress in 1802 and had combined military and civil responsibilities. Part of its civil responsibilities was the maintenance and improvement of inland water-

ways and harbors, formulating and executing plans for flood control, operating dams and locks, and approving plans for the construction of bridges, wharves, piers, and other works over navigable waters.

After the end of the Civil War in 1865, the Corps of Engineers expanded its river and harbor improvement work and its administrative functions. Corps of Engineers established district offices throughout the United States. Each district had an engineer officer in charge who reported directly to the Chief of Engineers in Washington, DC. This changed in 1888 when

engineer divisions were created with administrative jurisdiction over the district offices.

The National Archives—Mid Atlantic Region has records from the following district and sub-district offices of the Corps of Engineers: Baltimore, MD; Huntington, WV; Norfolk, VA; Pittsburgh, PA; Philadelphia, PA; Delaware City, DE; Fort Delaware, DE; and Fort Mott, NJ.
