Laboratory Employee Receives National Recognition for Working With Minority-Owned Businesses

It's been more than three years since the raging Cerro Grande fire ripped through Los Alamos. Memories of the disaster live on; however, there was a positive light at the end of tunnel.

That ray of light was demonstrated through many hardworking individuals dedicated to the recovery efforts of the devastating event. One of those individuals was Stephen Mee, program manager for the Facility & Waste-Operations-Cerro Grande Rehabilitation Project (FWO-CGRP).

On September 17th, 2003, Mee was honored during the National Entrepreneurial Conference & Expo held in Washington, D.C. Mee was given the National "Minority Small Business Advocate of the Year" Award, for his efforts in contracting more than half his procurement dollars to either 8(a), womanowned, Native Americanowned, or HUBZone– certified companies in northern New Mexico.

These companies were awarded contracts during the FWO-CGRP, which managed the extensive work of erosion control, forest thinning, and cultural site assessments on more than 27,000 acres on the Laboratory that had been affected by the May 2000 Grande Cerro fire. A few of the Laboratory's Small Business Office (SBO) staff members

were also in Washington, D.C., advising smallbusiness owners on how to do business with the Laboratory. More than 1,000 small business owners, federal agencies, and private industries participated in the event.

The SBO nominated Mee for his prestigious award and congratulates him for a job well done.

"Receiving this award shows just how committed the Laboratory is in working with small businesses," said Mee.


The forum will provide an opportunity for construction firm owners to learn about upcoming construction projects, as well as information on Laboratory standards and requirements in safety, security, and procurement.
