Intermediate Injury Prevention

Course Description

This 3-½ day course builds upon the knowledge and skills addressed in the Introduction to Injury Prevention. Through a combination of lecture, hands-on, and computer-based activities it reviews the basics of:

- Data interpretation
- Coalition building
- Program planning
- Evaluation
- Marketing and advocacy

Course Prerequisites

The prerequisite for this course is the Introduction to Injury Prevention course.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Describe basic injury data collection and analysis techniques;
- · Interpret injury statistical measures;
- Utilize WISQARS, a web-based injury database system;
- Describe complex contributing factors of injury, such as alcohol;

- Implement strategies for injury prevention coalition maintenance;
- Develop comprehensive injury intervention initiatives:
- Evaluate programs using formative and process evaluation methods;
- Develop basic injury prevention marketing and advocacy strategies.

Who should attend? The target audience for this course is community members, tribal and IHS employees, and others who are especially interested in data, program evaluation, and marketing strategies to preventing injuries in their community, including:

- · tribal health board members
- tribal health directors
- tribal council members
- · law enforcement
- emergency services personnel
- CHRs
- environmental health personnel
- injury coalition members
- injury prevention staff
- medical providers

- Injuries are the <u>leading cause of</u>
 <u>death</u> for all Native Americans, ages
 1-44
- Injuries take the life of a Native American child <u>each day</u>
- Injuries kill more Native American children than <u>all other causes</u> combined

Leading Causes of Death, 1999-2003 Among Native Americans, Aged 1-19 Yrs.

- Pneumonia/Flu-1.5%
- Heart Disease 2.0%
- Congenital Anomalies 2.9%
- Cancer 4.4%
- All Other 14.2%
- Injuries 75%
