The Marzinski Horse Trail and Campground were developed for the horse enthusiasts, who enjoy riding through a forested quiet trail system. The trail is accessed by both the Marzinski Trai head and Campground and the Steinberg Trailhead. The campground is located just south of Highway M-55, west of Wellston off Marzinski Road. Steinberg Trailhead is closer to Manistee off the Stronach Road cut-off, on the east side off Steinberg Read. Neither trail head is maintained for horse use in the winter months. Steinberg Trailhead doubles as a snowmobile trailhead. The Forest Service and volunteers maintain the trail system, which is marked by cedar-routed signs and posts..

LOCATION

Marzinski Trailhead and Campground is located between the communities of Wellston and Manistee.

ACCESS

From Wellston, travel west on M-55 11 miles to Marzinski Road. Go south to the entrance which will be on the east side of Marzinski Road. From the junction of M-31 and M-55, drive east about 7 miles. Go south to the entrance. Steinberg Trailhead is about 4.5 miles from Manistee.

SEASON


The trail is open year around. Please check with the Manistee Ranger Station at 231-743-2211 for additional information.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE

More than 20 miles of maintained trail with several loop options. The campground has 20 sites, some with hitching posts, fire rings, and picnic tables. There is a vault toilet and a bulletin board. **Water must be brought in.** The area is not maintained in the winter season.

FEES

There are no fees associated with this trail system or trail heads.



CONSIDERATIONS

Trails are open to non-motorized use only. They are designed for horse riders but may be used by hikers as well.

Care should be taken to keep the trail system and campground clean. Please pack out what you pack in.

Horse riders are asked not to access the Little Manistee River and be careful when crossing adjacent roads.
