Kneff Lake Campground provides a wide variety of camping, swimming, and picnicking experiences in wooded areas along the shore of Kneff Lake. Kneff Lake is a designated trout lake and is stocked with rainbow trout. Although a portion of the lake is located on private land, the majority of it is located on National Forest land.

LOCATION

This campground is located in Crawford County, Michigan. The nearest community is Grayling, about 8 miles west.

ACCESS

From the west, travel east 6.5 miles on M-72 from the junction of Business I-75 and M-72. Turn south on Stephan Bridge Road for approximately 1 mile, then east on Forest Service Road 4003 about 1 mile to the area.

From the east, leave M-72 at a point about 9 miles west of its intersection with M-18. Turn south on Stephan Bridge Road for approximately 1 mile, then east on Forest Service Road 4003 about 1 mile to the area.



SEASON

Kneff Lake is open for fishing from the last Saturday in April through September 30 (trout season). The campground opens the weekend before Memorial Day. Please check with the Ranger Station at Mio regarding the concessionaire and dates outside the managed season.
