## Volunteer Opportunities

Volunteer opportunities are found in the Medical Center, Nursing Home Care Unit, and our Community-Based Outpatient Clinics. Our goal is to meet the needs of our veterans while meeting your interests, skills, and talents as a volunteer.

Opportunities are categorized in the following areas:

#### Clerical

Volunteers provide administrative support to departments such as data entry, answering phones, running errands, assisting with department-specific projects. Departments include: radiology, clinical support, and radiation therapy.

#### Clinical

Volunteers are trained to interact with veteran patients such as reading, listening, and socializing with patients, feeding patients during mealtime, writing letters on behalf of the patient, and much more! Departments include: nursing units, ICU, nursing home, recreation therapy, and emergency room.

## Community

Volunteers serve as a liaison for the incoming community (patients, visitors) and assist them with finding their way throughout the Medical Center. Areas include: patient escort program, hospitality/messenger, information desk, and making meals memorable.

## Time Commitment

While any time you are able to give to our veterans is valuable, we do ask for a minimum time commitment for our volunteers.

Adult volunteers: Four (4) hours per week
College students: Three (3) hours per week
High School students: Two (2) hours per week
(afternoons only during the school year)

Don't worry! If you are unable to serve the minimum time commitment, there are other opportunities available.

If your time availability only allows you to volunteer a few hours a month, no problem. You can serve as a messenger or give some time reading to a patient.

Still tight on time? Well, we have more opportunities to choose from!

If you are affiliated with a group (Fraternity, Sorority, Boy/Girl Scouts, Service Organization like the Veterans of Foreign Wars, or even your place of employment, etc.), we have opportunities for you!

Organizations visit our veteran residents at the Nursing Home (located right across the street from the Medical Center) for bingo games, ice cream socials, "happy hour," summer cookouts, entertainment, and much more. Organizations come in as a group and with assistance from Recreation Therapy, assist with the event! We ask there be no more than 10 volunteers in a group.

## **Donations**

## **Monetary**

Monetary gifts are placed in our General Post Funds (money designated to use only for our veterans). The following General Post Funds need continuous funding:
