

Non-native invasive species

Non-native invasive species are known to occur on the Forest, however they have only recently been actively surveyed for. Control efforts have focused on pastures on the Forest. A list of known and expected non-native plant species and their risk ranking has been drafted for the Forest to use during botanical surveys; Table 1 shows the species and their risk rankings. A ranking of “1” means the species is considered a severe threat and is a highly invasive non-native plant known to invade natural habitats and replace native species. Non-native plants less invasive than those in rank “1” with less impact on native plant communities generally found in disturbed areas but are capable of spreading into adjacent undisturbed areas pose a significant threat and are given a ranking of “2”. Plants with a ranking of “3” pose a lesser threat, and are non-native plants normally found, spread, and remain in areas of ground disturbance with full sunlight or partial shade. Non-native plants that are problematic elsewhere including parts of West Virginia but whose status is unknown within the Monongahela National Forest proclamation boundary are given a ranking of “4”. Plants ranked as “4” are the “watch list” for the Forest.
