STATEMENT OF WORK / SPECIFICATIONS

YOKUM STREET BARRIER

General

1.01 Scope of Project

A. The project includes furnishing all materials, supplies, equipment and labor, to install seven (7) government furnished wood utility poles and three hundred (300) feet of heavy duty poly barrier net. The net shall be installed on Forest Service property adjacent to a baseball field

1.02 Description

- A. The barrier net shall be installed approximately one (1) foot away from the existing chain link fence, on Forest Service property. The barrier net shall be hung from vinyl coated cable with metal hog rings. The cable shall be secured to each utility pole. Turnbuckles shall be used to tighten the cable. The lower, outsides ends of the cable and net shall be installed so that they may be unfastened and curtained during the winter months.
- B. The Contractor is responsible for trimming any Government owned tree branches that may interfere with installation of poles and net.
- C. The Contractor is responsible for taking down any Government owned chain link fence material that may interfere with installation of poles and net. The Contractor shall notify the Government of the sections of fence that interfere with installation of poles and net. The Contractor is responsible for reinstalling any Government owned chain link fence material that was taken down. It is anticipated that the chain link fence posts will not have to be removed.
- D. The Contractor shall have access to ball field, the city park and the Government property.

1.03 Location

A. The project is located at 731 Yokum Street, Elkins, West Virginia.

1.04 Facilities

- A. There are water, power and restroom facilities on the project site. The Contractor may use these facilities at no charge. The Contractor shall not use the Government's dumpster.
- B. The Contractor may store materials and equipment on site on Government property. The COR shall approve staging and storage areas prior to use.

Yokum Street Barrier Net

1.05 Clean Up

- A. The Contractor shall remove excess materials, and debris from the site on a daily basis. The Contractor shall not use the Government's dumpster on the site.
- B. The Contractor shall repair any ruts over 3 inches in depth on the Government and adjacent owner's property.

1.06 Government Furnished Materials

- A. Wood utility poles Class 3, 50 foot long, CCA treated wood utility poles. 7 total.
- B. Heavy Duty Poly Barrier Net Two (2) 150 foot long rolls of 37.5 foot wide heavy duty poly barrier net, commonly used on driving ranges.

Technical

- 2.01 Materials
- A. Cable Vinyl coated, 3/16" cable.
- B. Turnbuckles 3/8" x 6" jaw-eye, hot dipped galvanized
- C. Fastening hardware hot dipped galvanized
- D. Backfill Backfill material shall be suitable native material or crusher run limestone. Suitable material includes native material free of rocks over 2 inches, mud, or frozen materials.

2.02 Execution

A. Tree trimming

- 1. Only branches that will interfere with the installation of the net shall be removed.
- 2. Branches shall be trimmed and removed in a manner that does not damage the existing chain link fence or other existing structures on Government or adjacent property.
- 3. Branches and debris shall be removed from the site on a daily basis.
- B. Chain Link Fence Removal and Reinstallation
- 1. The Contractor shall submit a plan to the COR showing which sections of fence need to be removed to install the net.

- 2. The Contractor shall reinstall sections of the chain link fence that were removed by the Contractor.
- 3. The Contractor is not responsible for removing, or replacing, the signs or base boards on the chain link fence. The signs and boards are to be removed by the adjacent property owner.
- 4. Any chain link fence that is removed shall be handled and stored on site, in a manner that does not damage the fence. Any damage to the chain link fence, barb wire, rails, tensioning system, or posts shall be repaired by the Contractor at the Contractor's expense.

C. Poles

- 1. Poles shall be set in drilled or augured holes, not to exceed 6 inches larger in diameter than the poles. Poles shall be set plumb.
- 2. The backfill shall be tamped in place in layers not exceed 6 inches in depth. The top layer of backfill shall be mounded.

D. Net

- 1. Install net as recommend by the manufacturer. The net shall be attached to the cable with hog rings.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

- 1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:
- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
