Frequently Asked Questions about Hearing Aids and Hearing Tests at the Portland VA Medical Center

1) Can I get hearing aids through the Portland VA Medical Center?

You can get hearing aids through the Portland VA if you:

- are 0% service connected (or more) for hearing or tinnitus
- are 10% service connected (or more) for any condition
- are an OEF/OIF veteran discharged within the last two years
- were a Prisoner of War (POW)
- received a Purple Heart
- receive Aid & Attendance from the VA
- are a housebound veteran
- are a blind veteran enrolled in VIST or BROS
- need hearing aids to help you manage a serious medical condition (your doctor can refer you to audiology if this is the case for you)

2) I don't know if I'm service connected. How do I find out?

You can call either Regional Office or the eligibility office and ask.

Helpful Hint: If you have never filed a claim with Regional Office for a disability caused by your military service, then you most likely are not service connected.

3) Can I get my hearing tested at the Portland VA Medical Center?

- In most cases, you will need to ask your primary care doctor to refer you to audiology if you would like to get your hearing tested. Your request may or may not be granted.
- Usually it's best to get a referral to audiology from your doctor.
 However, you can call the audiology clinic directly to make an appointment if you are:
 - o 0% service connected (or more) for hearing or tinnitus
 - o 10% service connected (or more) for any condition

4) I don't qualify for hearing aids through the VA, and I want to buy hearing aids outside of the VA. How do I do that?

There are many audiologists in the community who fit hearing aids. Here are some ways to find one:

- Ask friends and family if they know any audiologists they would recommend.
- Look in the yellow pages under "audiologist."

5) I don't qualify for hearing aids through the VA, and I can't afford to buy them outside of the VA. What can I do about that?
