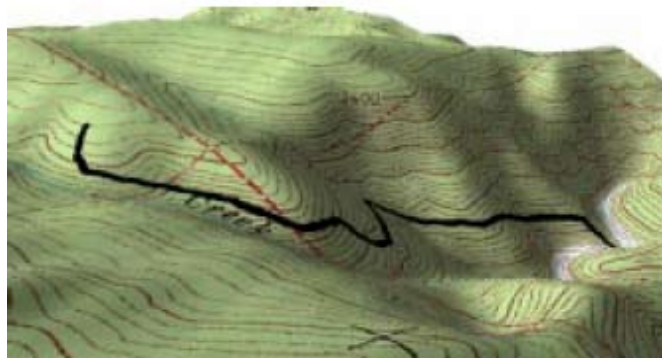

Note:

Open water sources are easily contaminated by human or animal waste. Water from springs, lakes, ponds, and streams should be properly treated before drinking. One recommended method of treatment is to bring clear water to a rolling boil for five minutes.

Trail Description

This trail provides an enjoyable hike through a forest of oaks, maples, cedars and ferns. Bring your camera to capture the outstanding canyon views along the way. Fall is an especially beautiful time to visit. The colorful display provides a breathtaking hike.



Although a little steep and rough at the end, most of the trail offers a pleasant workout. The trail ends at the Little North Fork of the Feather River. This is a good spot for trout fishing. Perfect rocks for a relaxing siesta in the shade or sun can be easily found. Spend some time and enjoy the peaceful surroundings.

(The trail is generally open from mid-April to mid-November, snow and road conditions permitting.)
