COD Computer-Based Training - (Downloadable PC software)

The COD System Web site CBT simulates the COD System and functionality available to a school administrator. The CBT allows school staff to practice locating and creating information for Grants and Direct loans and explore the basic functions of the COD Web site through 8 self-paced lessons. The COD System Web Site CBT is upgraded with web site functionality through April 2007 and uses fictitious data for over eight hundred (800) persons and twenty (20) schools. Two new CBT's are also available for Grant and Direct Loan reports. Additionally three separate simulations guide a user through the eMPN process. There is one each for Subsidized/Unsubsidized loans, Grad Plus and Parent Plus loans. These simulate the eMPN process and can be downloaded to your school web site or used for training purposes at college financial aid informational meetings. One additional eMPN simulation is available for the financial aid professional for assistance in eMPN web site functionality specific to the school user.

The program requires a Windows 98 or higher operating system with an ODBC driver for Microsoft Access 2000. Your screen resolution should be set to 1024 x 768 or higher.

COD Technical Reference 08-09

The COD Technical Reference is an excellent resource for understanding how Direct Loans and the Master Promissory Note (MPN) are processed through the COD system. Generally, Volume 1, Section II will contain a layman's language description of what has changed from the previous release. Volume II, Section I, titled "Implementation Guide," will explain in layman's language the Origination Process, Disbursing funds, and the processing, and linking, of MPN. Volume VI, the Appendices, contains important information on funding levels, reports and a handy glossary.

For those schools using EdExpress in combination with another software product, Volume III contains an Implementation Guide geared to that type of solution. Volume IV is dedicated to Direct Loan Tools, an FSA product that assists schools in their cash management and reconciliation activities as required in the Direct Loan Program.

The Servicing web site is a wonderful resource for schools and student/borrowers to access detailed account information available from the Direct Loan Servicing System.

Schools

The Direct Loan Servicing Online School Site provides schools with resources and reports designed to help them effectively manage their Direct Loan Program.

<u>Account Lookup</u>

Schools are able to view live account data for students including balances, disbursements, account status, and separation dates. They can also review repayment estimates under each repayment plan based on the student's actual loan balance.

<u>Reporting Tools</u>

Summary and detailed reports are available for entrance counseling, exit counseling, delinquency and portfolio management. Schools may also use the subscription function to select the frequency of how often they would like to receive a particular report.

Students/Borrowers

The Borrower Services Site provides Direct Loan borrowers with several tools to easily manage their student loan account. Borrowers are able to view resources and updates to the loan program, as well as download loan-related forms. With a PIN, borrowers have access to detailed account information, the ability to update or make account changes, make online payments, submit online postponement applications and complete the exit counseling session. A borrower may also use their PIN to initiate a consolidation of their Direct Loans.
