## Beautiful Ruggedness


The Popo-Agie (pronounced "po-po-zsha") Wilderness, 101,870 acres in size, is a wild and rugged landscape dominated by sheer granite walls, glacial cirques, alpine lakes, and clear, cold flowing streams home to several species of trout. More than 20 summits rise above 12,000 feet.

The ruggedness of this country betrays it natural fragility. Country near or above timberline is extremely sensitive to human impacts. Please practice Leave No Trace as you recreate.



#### Nature's Extremes
