## DIRECT DONATION OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (IT) AND RESEARCH EQUIMENT

**1. PURPOSE.** This directive provides acquisition and materiel management policies required to implement the Stevenson-Wydler Technology Innovations Act of 1980, as amended (Stevenson-Wydler Act), and Executive Order 12999 of April 17, 1996, Educational Technology.

**2. POLICY.** Specific policy and procedures pertaining to the responsibility for donation of excess IT and research equipment directly to schools and institutions conducting technical and scientific education and computer training will be adhered to by all VA entities.

**3. RESPONSIBILITY.** The Deputy Assistant Secretary (DAS) for Acquisition and Materiel Management (90) will ensure a program is established within the Office of Acquisition and Materiel Management (OA&MM) to review, develop, and issue Department-wide guidance and support.
