FOREST SUPERVISOR'S ORDER

Pursuant to 36 Code of Federal Regulations 261.50(b), the following changes in road closure status shall be made to the Lolo National Forest Travel Plan and the enforcement of such changes shall be as authorized in Subpart B, Part 261, Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations. This order will become effective upon signing and will remain in effect until rescinded by a subsequent order.

36 CFR 261.54 – National Forest System Roads

1. Description of roads:

- a) Fawn Creek Road, NFSR #4349, milepost 1.00 to 5.60, starting in Section 7, T.17N., R.15W.
- b) Cottonwood Lakes Road, NFSR #477, milepost 2.1 to 3.6, starting in Section 36, T.17N, R.15W.

The following is prohibited:

- 1) Using any motorized vehicle (except snowmobiles and logging-related traffic) on the National Forest System Roads listed. (36 CFR 261.54(a))
- 2) Operating any motor vehicle in excess of 20 miles per hour. (36 CFR 261.54 (d)).

2. Description of road:

- a) Beaver Finley Road, NFSR #9974, milepost 0.0 to 3.1, starting in Section 14, T.16N., R.16W.

The following is prohibited:

- 1) Using any motorized vehicle on the National Forest System Road listed with the following exceptions: logging traffic is permitted weekdays (Monday through Friday) from 3:00 AM to 6:00 PM. Snowmobile traffic is permitted weekdays from 6:00 PM to 3:00 AM and weekends from Friday at 6:00 PM to Monday at 3:00 AM. (36 CFR 261.54(a))

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
- 2) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

- 3) Owners or lessees in the area.
- 4) Persons engaged in a business, trade, or occupation in the area.

Penalty:

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559 AND 3571).
