ORDER NO. 14-08-16 Shasta-Trinity National Forest Temporary Closure

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Yolla Bolly Middle Eel Wilderness Closure Area located within the Yolla Bolla Ranger District on the Shasta-Trinity National Forest. This Order is effective September 30, 2008, through May 16, 2009.

- 1. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands within the Yolla Bolly Middle Eel Wilderness Closure Area. The boundary of the Yolla Bolly Middle Eel Wilderness Closure Area begins at Tomhead Saddle, then continues northwest to Black Rock Mountain, then continues south to West Low Gap, then continues south along Powell Ridge to Bear Wallow Camp, then continues east to Devil's Hole Ridge, then continues south to The Knob, then continues east along Buck Creek to the forest boundary, then continues northwest along the forest boundary to the starting point, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.53(e).
- 2. Being on any National Forest System trail within the Yolla Bolly Middle Eel Wilderness Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.55(a).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- 1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- 2. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- 3. Residents living on private land within the Yolla Bolly Middle Eel Wilderness Closure Area, to the extent necessary to access their residences.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.
